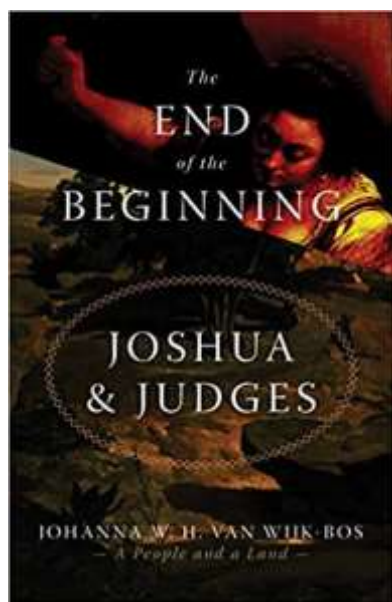


September Sermon Series “A PEOPLE and a LAND”

It is with great joy that I welcome visiting scholar Dr. Johanna van Wijk-Bos to our faith community for a special sermon series this September as she shares her recently published trilogy “A People and a Land,” covering the books of Joshua, Judges, Samuel and Kings.

As we continue to celebrate our 250th Anniversary at St. Peter’s, Johanna’s work on these books of the Hebrew Bible shed light on what it means to engage in a community of faith amid complex social and political realities.

Born and raised in the Netherlands during World War II, Johanna has a particular lens through which she understands God’s voice in Scripture, a lens that recognizes unheard and marginalized voices, prophetically addresses social and political inequalities and fosters deep compassion for the suffering of others.

Johanna was the first woman to receive academic tenure at Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary and is a critical voice for the radical inclusion of all God’s people within theological discourse. Johanna was my Hebrew Scripture professor at Louisville Seminary and truly transformed how I approach Scripture in today’s complex world.
